Goals

- Increase the number of health care systems implementing procedures for food insecurity identification and referrals
- Increase number of food insecurity referrals made by hospitals and health centers
- Increase number of food pantry lists made available to hospitals
- Increase number of Prescription for Produce programs established and redemption of coupons



By the Numbers

- 20 residents, served by the Department of Social Services, provided input on food insecurity and project structure
- 3 farmers markets joined on as additional sites for the Prescription for Produce program to provide patients who are identified as food-insecure with a coupon to access healthy foods

Success Stories

- 1. Health care professionals increased their knowledge of food assistance programs in Orange County and received updated referral information to connect patients with resources
- 2. Health sites implemented new patient screening protocols, including the Hunger Vital Signs Food Insecurity Screening, and made referrals to local Orange County food assistance programs
